## Subject: - Discontinuing services on USSD 1.0 system

\*99#, a USSD based mobile banking service of NPCI was initially launched in November 2012. The service had limited reach and only two TSPs were offering this service i.e. MTNL & BSNL. Understanding the importance of mobile banking in financial inclusion in general and of \*99# in particular, various regulatory/trade bodies came together to ensure on boarding of all TSPs on \*99# (USSD 1.0). With the wider ecosystem (11 TSPs), \*99# was dedicated to the nation by Hon'ble Prime minister on 28<sup>th</sup> August 2014, as part of Pradhan Manti Jan Dhan Yojna.

NPCI launched Unified Payments Interface (UPI) with member banks on 25th August, 2016. UPI allows account holders across banks to send and receive money using a unique id known as UPI id or payment address. UPI allows users the facility to generate their own UPI ID. Besides UPI ID, user can also send money using the conventional financial address i.e. Account number + IFSC and also, through emerging option of AADHAAR number. Conceptualized as a mobile application based solution primarily catering to internet compatible phones (smart-phone users), UPI is now available for non-internet based mobile devices (smartphone as well as basic phones) in the form of dialling option (\*99# ) and is known as USSD 2.0 (available on the existing number \*99#). This functionality i.e. USSD 2.0 is launched along with BHIM on 30<sup>th</sup> December 2016.

In USSD 1.0 (existing \*99#), 51 banks were live. Post the introduction of USSD 2.0, these banks have started migrating to new system, after performing necessary migration process (Documentation & certification). 41 banks have already moved to USSD 2.0 and remaining banks are in the process of doing so. All the new members are on-boarded on USSD 2.0 only. NPCI has made both the systems active (USSD 1.0 & 2.0) to facilitate this migration up to 31<sup>st</sup> July 2017.

USSD 1.0 system shall discontinue from 1<sup>st</sup> August 2017. Members are advised to take note of it and circulate to their respective internal teams for timely migration to USSD 2.0 if not done so far.
